What is scientific literature?

Terminology

- Publish- to produce a work in printed /electronic form
- Manuscript- the written document submitted to a journal
- Article- a nonfiction piece of writing published in a journal
- Scientific journal a periodical publication intended to further the progress of science, usually by reporting new research
- Citation- Article cited as a reference in another article

Types of Journal

Scope

- Broad
 - Cell, NEJM, Nature, Science

- A particular discipline
 - Analytical Chemistry, Neuron, Applied Geochemistry
- Highly specialized
 - Neuropeptides, Journal of Shellfish Research

Open access vs. Subscription based journals

Predatory Journals

- Definition (Nature, 2019)
 - "Predatory journals and publishers are entities that prioritize self-interest at the expense of scholarship and are characterized by false or misleading information, deviation from best editorial and publication practices, a lack of transparency, and/or the use of aggressive and indiscriminate solicitation practices."
- Beall's list, Caball's list, DOAJ (Directory of Open Access Journals)

Indexing Databases

Citation index- is a bibliographic database

- Science Citation Index (SCI) (Web of Science)
- Scopus (Elsevier)
- Index Medicus (Medline)
- PubMed, PubMed Central
- Embase (Biomedical pharmacological database)
- Index Copernicus(IC)
- Indian Citation Index (ICI)

Publication Metrics

Journal Metrics

- Impact Factor (IF)
 - Average number of citations of the articles published in the last two years

 h5 index- number of articles(h) that have received at least 'h' citations in the last 5 years

Author metrics

 h index- number of articles(h) that have received at least 'h' citations

i10-index – number of articles with at least 10 citations
